What is an ATA Carnet?

An ATA Carnet, often called a "Merchandise Passport" or "Passport for Goods", is an international customs document that allows goods to be temporarily imported into foreign countries without paying duties or taxes. It simplifies customs clearance for items like trade show exhibits, professional equipment, and commercial samples. The acronym ATA comes from the French and English words *Admission Temporaire / Temporary Admission*.

Who Issues ATA Carnets?

ATA Carnets are issued by **National Guaranteeing Associations (NGAs)** in each participating country. These are usually **Chambers of Commerce or similar trade organizations**, authorized by their customs authorities and recognized by the **ICC World Chambers Federation**.

There are **over 80 countries** in the ATA Carnet system, each with its own authorized issuing body.

Key Features

- Validity: Up to 1 year (6 months for fairs/exhibitions).
- Coverage: Accepted in 80–100+ countries worldwide.
- Multiple Trips: One carnet can be used for unlimited entries and exits during its validity.
- Goods Covered:
 - Commercial samples
 - o Professional equipment (e.g., cameras, tools)
 - o Goods for exhibitions and trade shows
- Goods NOT Covered: Consumables, perishables, explosives, and disposables.

Benefits

- **Duty & Tax-Free:** Avoids paying customs duties and VAT.
- **Simplifies Procedures:** One standardized document for all participating countries.
- **Cost Savings:** Eliminates need for multiple bonds or guarantees.
- **Speeds Up Clearance:** Reduces delays at customs.

How It Works

- Present the ATA Carnet at customs each time you enter or exit a country.
- Goods must be re-exported before the carnet expires.
- If goods are not returned, duties and taxes become payable.
- Carnet acts as a **customs declaration and guarantee** for temporary admission.
